"BPAT Software Issues as Reported by Backflow Prevention Assembly Testers"

For many years there have been backflow prevention assembly tracking software programs utilized by enforcement agencies to assist with their Cross Connection Control Program. Some are user friendly; while others are nightmares for the tester and do not really assist with proper enforcement measures.

The following are just a few comments received from Backflow Prevention Assembly Testers (BPATs) about software program issues. Some comments relate back to enforcement policies established by the local water purveyor and/or plumbing inspection department.

Quotes from BPATs:

- "Some programs won't give you the building information until after you test assembly – they issue a reference #" Note: All software should allow you to see the entire record before any entry of new information.
- "Program won't let you change the backflow information and wants you to put replace – even though we did not replace it. Prior company did to turn in the information!"

Note: Was the original information incorrect or has the assembly been changed at some point and the software entry not updated?

- Program adds old backflow with new backflow so both are due Customer keeps getting letters for past due backflow preventers that are not there" Note: Software must delete testing requirement of removed assembly.
- "Too many different forms for each jurisdiction Houston area has several MUD's and different programs are requiring different information – Hard to keep up and not uniform requirements."

Note: A community MUST have common software in all MUD's for a successful backflow program.

When BFPA missing – the tester is expected to find it and city (software company) doesn't believe us that it is not there."

Note: Tester must notify enforcement so they can investigate and correct.

Agenda Item #1. President's Report: Jeff Stricker called the meeting to order and asked everyone to turn off their cell phone and no game playing. He then asked for a moment of silence. Agenda Item #2. Secretary's Report: Minutes were in the newsletter. Joe Young made a motion to accept. Seconded and Passed. INFO.

Agenda Item #6. Meal: American Backflow sponsored the meal of 9 pepperoni and 3 vegetarian pizzas. Bill had the pizza cut into 6 large pieces. A Caesar salad was also provided. Agenda Item #7. Raffle: November is our annual raffle. Summary in The Chapter Chatter. INFO.

Agenda Item #8. Webmaster. Matt said he needs to update website. INFO.

Agenda Item #9. SAWS: Emilie Prado, SAWS Backflow Administrator, ask that testers not hold onto a T&M until the customer pays the tester, there is a 10-day window from test date to date of submission. January 1st, testers will not be allowed to submit test reports beyond the 10-day window. The testers do need to submit a failed report to local enforcement agency; Emilie said to submit the report as "under repair". Emilie said a "failed report is better than no report". This is to assist the customer and ensure that they do not fall into non-compliance and get issued fees from SAWS.

SAWS has two positions open for backflow inspectors. This would include on-the-job training and CEUs. Emilie said, "Call SAWS if you know someone is looking." Carmen will be taking over Emilie's admin position as Emilie will be doing more compliance work with face to face with customers to get their backflows into compliance. She added that, "Hopefully before the end of the year they will catch up with customer calls." INFO.

Agenda Item #10. San Antonio Irrigation Association (SAIA): Keith Waldrep is now president and Art Trejo is also their treasurer. They are looking at upgrading the annual, one day, San Antonio Irrigation and Landscape Expo (STILE) that is normally held in January or February. 

He reminded everyone that all (non-potable) gauges must have -NP on the end of the Model Number to become the correct new Model Number on ALL documentation. Testing starts at 5:00 PM and membership is checked. Extra gauges can be tested for \$45 each, paid to the ABPA-SA treasurer. INFO.

Agenda Item #16. Attendance Award. There were 7 members with perfect attendance. Kevin LePrete won the \$200 drawing. The \$100 award for missing only one meeting included the "losers" from the perfect attendance drawing. The winner was Freddy Zavala with the number 9. Some software programs have insisted on a reading on #2 check for R/P – when There is no reading on #2 check – know TCEQ has corrected software – however still having some requesting it."

Note: TCEQ requires USC testing procedures and #2 check pressure is NOT obtainable, only closed tight or leaking information is obtainable.

"Cannot look up number of assemblies – model #'s and serial #'s by address – You have to have at least one serial # of an assembly to look up information for a particular property."

Note: All software must allow lookup by address.

- "Need One software system State wide." Note: This becomes a sticky competitive situation, however, TCEQ could provide a guidance document with specific requirements that MUST be adhered to by any software provider to be approved in Texas.
- "Comments on electronic T&M report submitted are not being reviewed if assembly passing when submitted for possible water purveyor follow-up." Note: Software companies could include a check-box if comments are included to flag the T&M for review.
- "Electronic reporting often has incorrect backflow assembly information and cannot be edited by backflow tester."
 Note: All software MUST be able to accept corrections in case of typos etc.

- "Too many issues/hiccups!"
- Note: All software must meet a specific standard of TCEQ.
- "I believe a standardized form would benefit enforcement and testers also help with software issues."

Note: TCEQ is reviewing the current T&M which will have ramifications for falsifying a T&M report, whether submitted by paper or software.

Bottom-line: Some BPAT software should be reviewed by the local enforcement agencies to assure it is tester – customer and enforcement friendly. Software inadequacies create adverse effects for the entire CCC Program.






